Chair - Dr. Nir Shoham - Hazon



Dr. Shoham-Hazon has completed an Ophthalmology residency at the Kaplan Medical Center in Rehovot, Israel, in January 2010. She works at the Mississauga Retina Institute, Burlington Laser Eye Centre, and Baycrest Health Sciences Centre. Dr. Arjmand is the recipient of numerous clinical awards and research grants and has
